No trash or bulky pickup Friday, Saturday as Hurricane Lane approaches

HONOLULU – The City and County of Honolulu has cancelled all trash and bulky item collections this Friday and Saturday and closed all refuse facilities as Hurricane Lane approaches.

The city will not double-back and collect households missed on Friday or Saturday, and asks residents to hold their trash, green waste or recyclables until the next scheduled collection date. If homeowners are unable to wait, they may drop off their waste at one of the city's [six convenience centers](#) once they reopen.

Bulky item collection is currently in Sector 8, which stretches from Niu Valley, Hawai'i Kai and Kalama Valley. Bulky item collection will be suspended Thursday evening and resume Monday. If items are not collected by Thursday evening, residents must return and secure all items on their property so they do not become projectiles. Sector 8 residents may reset their missed bulky items curbside on Sunday evening and leave them out until collected.

All convenience centers, transfer stations, H-POWER and the Waimānalo Gulch Sanitary Landfill are also closed Friday and Saturday to the public. Convenience Centers may reopen on Sunday, weather permitting.

Regularly scheduled trash and bulky item collection is anticipated to resume Monday, August 27.
