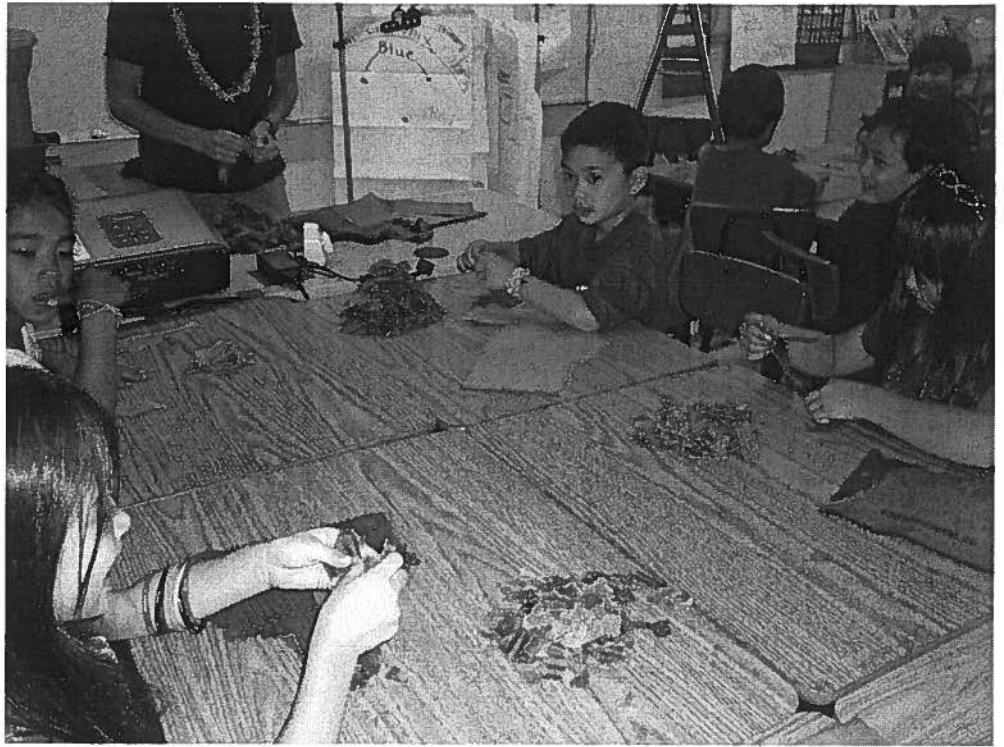

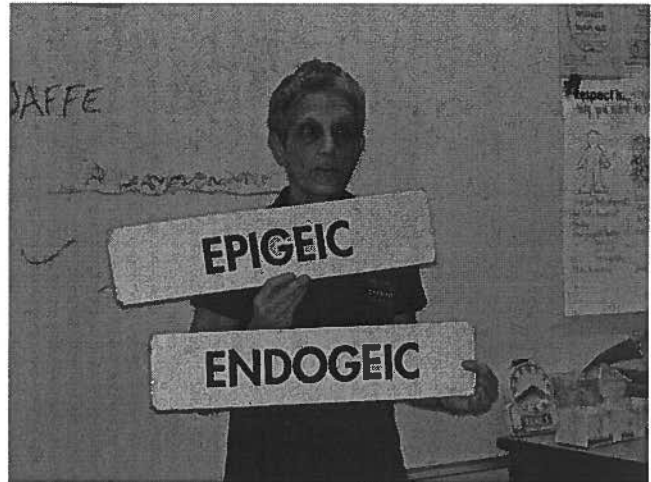
Which GLO does this show I was working on? Explain.

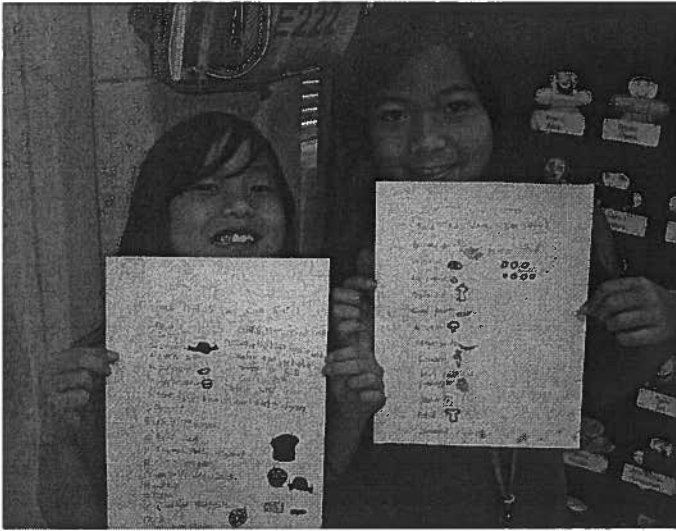
This is what I learned:
